KEN SUPPORTS ELLE

London is one of just five cities to be shortlisted for the Olympics in 2012. But the International Olympic Committee (IOC) said that the city's rail network was obsolete and called for substantial improvements in public transport if we are to win the final nomination. Pressure has been growing on Transport Secretary Alistair Darling to give an urgent go-ahead to the East London Line Extension (ELLE) after strong criticism of the capital's transport infrastructure from the Olympic chiefs. Ken Livingstone and his Conservative rival for Mayor Steve Norris joined forces to call on Mr Darling to find the money needed. Mr Livingstone said: "If they want to win the Olympics they have got to invest in transport." Mr Norris said: "If the IOC is a spur to getting it started, so much the better."



TONY SUPPORTS ELLE

Speaking on ITV's *London Tonight* Tony Blair recognised the importance of the £1 billion East London Line Extension. The Prime Minister admitted the need for major improvements had been brought to the fore by the threat of the capital losing its bid to host the 2012 Olympics. Mr Blair said: "There are issues about how we fund this (but) I don't think there is any question of us not doing them. These are investments we can't afford not to make."

The Government and the Mayor have already agreed a public funding package of up to £2.375 billion to help meet the costs of staging an Olympics in London in 2012. £1.5 billion will come from the lottery and up to £550 million from London Council Tax, which equates to a £20 a year increase on Band D council tax starting in 2006/7.
