UPPER NORWOOD JOINT LIBRARY

After a major, nine month refurbishment costing more than £1m, the Upper Norwood Joint Library in Westow Hill was re-opened at 7.30pm on Wednesday 23rd of June in an official cermony by the Mayors of both Croydon and Lambeth. Audrey Hammond marked the occasion with the presentation of a folder for pictures by local artists and included some of her own to get it started. The library re-opened to the public on Saturday 26th of June with a special fun day of activities, competitions and events.

The library is unique in local government because it is managed by a Joint Committee of councillors from Lambeth and Croydon, and although the annual running costs are provided by the two boroughs, UNJL sets its own policies, priorities and procedures and does not form part of either borough library services. It is the only independent library in the UK! The capital costs of the refurbishment were provided by the Crystal Palace Partnership/ SRB, Sure Start and the London Borough of Lambeth, resulting from a series of funding bids by the library staff. The library (which first opened in July 1900) now benefits from a host of new or improved facilities including a Youth Library, full disabled access, public toilet and lift to the first floor, a new ICT suite

with computers and full Internet access, a

upgraded heating, ventilation, lighting and

facilities

and accommodation including



new furniture, an enlarged Children's Library relocated to the ground floor, a Homework Club, private Advice Room and new collections of books. This will be in addition to the existing stock of 60,000 books, videos, CDs, DVDs, newspapers, magazines and CD-ROMs.

Library staff are also planning to establish a range of partnerships with organisations in the Crystal Palace and Upper Norwood area, to maximise learning, leisure, cultural, employment, training and educational opportunities for the whole community. Priorities will include services aimed at the under-25 age group, young children, excluded groups, the older learner and local businesses. Improvements in basic skills, literacy and reading development will also be targeted and 'focus groups' of community groups and library members will be set up to help to identify and meet local needs more effectively.
