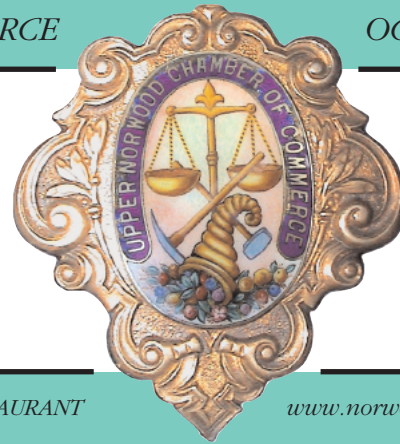

Under the new rules fireworks cannot be set off between 11pm and 7am except on Bonfire Night, Diwali and the New Year.

POST OFFICE DELAYS RELOCATION

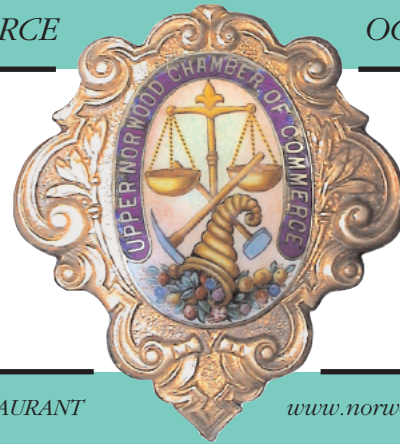
The Post Office Branch at 65 Westow Hill has delayed its relocation to 55-57 Westow Street (the newsagents opposite Safeways) because telephone lines could not be installed in time for the originally planned date. The Post Office will now be closing on Wednesday 3rd November 2004 and will open for business in its new location on Friday 5th November 2004.

OLYMPIC BID

GOOGLE LAUNCHES FROOGLE

Froogle is a new web site devised by Google. It is different from most other price engines because it doesn't charge any fees for listings or make any commissions on sales. Any company can submit a data feed and be included. But you can pay for advertising to be displayed in Froogle by using AdWords, which are the small display adverts that are also seen on other parts of the Google network.

Brothers Si Cristone (29) and Tyber O'Neil (24) have been busking in South London for several years but when they were younger they helped out in the family's greengrocer shops in Penge and Locksbottom.
